

# **“Farewell to Summer” Steel Shoot**

**Conduct of the shoot:** Shooters will fire in groups of 1-2 or more. All Shooters of the same group will fire together throughout all stages. Course of fire requires 3 magazines of 10 rounds for each stage.

## **Stage 1 – Runs 1-2-3**

Shooters will be called to the line in succession and make 3 runs of each stage.

Stage 1 – Run 1: A Magazine of 10 rounds. Shooter will begin in the shooting box. Upon command will Load & Make Ready. The RSO will then state Shooter Ready? – Standby. At the sound of the Tone, Shooter will fire 2 rounds each at 5 targets in any succession; except the Stop plate must be hit last. Upon completion of Run 1, Shooter will remain in shooting box and stand easy while time is recorded and hit-no hit / penalties are tabulated.

Stage 1 - Run 2 – Repeat of Run 1. Stage 1 – Run 3 – Repeat of Run 1/2.

There will be time to reload magazines between stages.

**Stage 2 – Runs 1-2-3** Procedure is an exact duplicate of Stage 1, except for a different target setup.

**Stage 3 – Runs 1-2-3** Procedure is an exact duplicate of Stage 2, except for a different target setup.

Upon completion of all shooters in a group for the Stage, all will move to Stage 2 / 3. The first Shooter of the group will move to the shooting box for Stage 2 / 3 and await commands.

Completion of firing by all shooters wishing to do so completes the “Farewell to Summer” Steel Shoot.

Final score is based on the best 2 of 3 runs per stage, plus penalties.+

Competitors are not required to remain at the range for awards.

Awards will be determined and presented to the winners remaining at the range. Awards to those who have left will be notified. They may pick up their award at the PRSA indoor range at their convenience or have it mailed to them. Arrangements for picking up awards are to be made with the Match Director.

# **“Farewell to Summer” Steel Shoot**

## **Rules:**

The range does not provide for food, snacks, drinks or seating – bring your own. There is an outdoor toilet facility.

Spectators and shooters waiting to fire and those remaining after firing are to conduct themselves in a manner so as not to impede the RSO or other range personnel or cause a disturbance to the shooter on the firing line. Abusive, loud or robust activities will not be tolerated. This is a Family function.

Shooters waiting in line to fire are to remain in the ready area and move to the firing line when called.

At the completion of their firing, shooters may remain in the range ready area or leave the area.

## **Weather:**

Shoot will be conducted regardless; heavy rain or lightning may cause delay, at the RSO & Match Directors discretion

## **Classification:**

There will be 2 Divisions, Rim Fire & Center Fire.

There will be 2 Classes, Production and Open.

Production = A standard duty gun as available from factory. Open = Everything else.

## **Equipment:**

Firearms: Any handgun, any type, any caliber, subject to Division and Classification.

Sights: Any sights are allowed, subject to Division and Classification.

Ammunition: No Tracers, Incendiary or Explosive type, are allowed.

Holsters: Holsters are not required, but may be used. Holsters, if used must be of a draw from the top type. Shoulder holsters are not allowed. Handguns w/arm braces & slings are prohibited in all classes.

Other Equipment: Magazine loaders recommended. All other, at the discretion of the Match Director.

## **Targets:**

All Targets will be STEEL, mounted at varying heights and distances. Shape and size will vary.

Regular targets will be White, Stop target will be Red. Targets will be repainted as needed.

## **Scoring:**

Time will be recorded by electronic timer under control of the RSO, and tabulated by the official scorer.

Scoring of hits/no hits will be conducted by range personnel and tabulated by the official scorer.

The 2 best scores of 3 Runs of each Stage will count for awards.

Disagreements will be handled by Range Scorer and RSO. The Match Directors decision will be final.
